Acts

The Damascus Road: Saul Converted

Then Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest² and asked letters from him to the synagogues of Damascus, so that if he found any who were of the Way, whether men or women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem.

Chapter 9

³ As he journeyed he came near Damascus, and suddenly a light shone around him from heaven.
⁴ Then he fell to the ground, and heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting Me?"

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The Salvation of Saul of Tarsus - Part 1 → Acts 9:1-22

- 1. Saul of Tarsus – He was one of the main young Jewish leaders, young & up and coming leaders of the Persecution against the church (see Acts 8)**
- 2. He had “authority” from the Chief Priests (the Priestly family – Annas, Caiaphas, etc. – the very folks who conspired to kill Jesus).**
- 3. He had a HIT LIST of Jews who converted to follow Jesus as the Messiah in many towns – including as far as Damascus (Syria) They were going to go to Prison, some even to death ... BUT**
- 4. Then out of nowhere, out of the blue – Jesus BARGED into His LIFE on the Road to Damascus – in a very UNIQUE Way – out of the ordinary ... Jesus CHOSE Him ...**
If you persecute the Church you are persecuting Jesus, personally

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Saul of Tarsus – years later when he recounted his years of following Christ to Timothy - 1 Timothy 1:12-17 – he never forgot what he was Before Christ Changed His Life:

“And I thank Christ Jesus our Lord who has enabled me, because He counted me faithful, putting me into the ministry, (13) although I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and an insolent man; but I obtained mercy because I did it ignorantly in unbelief. (14) And the grace of our Lord was exceedingly abundant, with faith and love which are in Christ Jesus. (15) This is a faithful saying and worthy of all acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am chief. (16) However, for this reason I obtained mercy, that in me first Jesus Christ might show all longsuffering, as a pattern to those who are going to believe on Him for everlasting life. (17) Now to the King eternal, immortal, invisible, to God who alone is wise, be honor and glory forever and ever. Amen.”

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- 1. PRAYER – If you remember at the end of Acts 7 in which Stephen PRAYED for his Persecutors (something we all should do) ... One of those Persecutors was Saul of Tarsus – the Ringleader of this outbreak of Persecution. He heard Stephen. It was this – that PRAYER and the PRAYER of the local church – that was KEY for GOD saving Saul.**
- 2. Although, Saul had “authority” from the Chief Priests in Jerusalem, the church HAS and ALL Authority – in Christ – the Keys of the Kingdom – when we pray for the Persecutors – God is Glorified.**
- 3. Jesus said, “But I say to you, love your enemies, bless those who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and PRAY for those who SPITEFULLY USE you and PERSECUTE you” – Matt 5:44**

Paul the Apostles said, “Bless those who PERSECUTE you; bless and do not curse” (Rom. 12:14) – what better way to Bless → PRAY?

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4. **JESUS Christ CHOSE all of His capital “A” Apostles (John 15). So, in this case – Saul of Tarsus would become #12 – The Apostle Paul replaced the “office” of Judas Iscariot (not Matthias → Acts 1:15-26). Thus, Jesus CHOSE Saul – who was also known as Paul, as the 12th Apostle ... Again, this is a UNIQUE Choosing ... not replicated. No Apostle was to search for a replacement for Judas, Jesus handled it. Jesus went out of his way to do this – and it was NOT a private matter. Those who were with Saul witnessed this, although they did not understand it all ... they all knew something happened.**
5. **This brings up the question → When, exactly, was Saul Saved ...**
 - a. **On the Road?**
 - b. **While waiting those 3 days?**
 - c. **When The Holy Spirit came into him when Ananias shared the Gospel with Saul and laid his hands on him, etc.?**

- 6. This Question relates to the Nature and Reality of Salvation, in the New Covenant / New Testament sense.**

As we've discussed this in past sermons ... New Covenant Salvation or Being Born Again, or Born of the Spirit or Born from Above ...

It is the Spiritual Work of Christ, via His Holy Spirit ... (ref. Eph. 1:13-14)

- a. The Sinner hears the Gospel of Christ (the Word of Truth, Word of God)**
- b. The Holy Spirit convicts the Sinner of his/her sinfulness**
- c. The Sinner Repents and Trusts in Christ for his/her Salvation**
- d. The Holy Spirit comes into that person and he/she is Born Again in Christ.**

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So, why did Ananias have to lay his hands on Saul for Saul to Receive the Holy Spirit (i.e. be Saved in Christ, become Born Again in Christ) and for Saul to receive his sight? Does everyone who is wanting to be saved, have to have a saved person lay their hands on them to be saved?

These are good questions.

Remember I've said over and over again, the book of Acts is a narrated Historical Timeline – a History Book – NOT a Book of Doctrinal Teachings. We find the Apostolic Doctrinal Teachings in Romans thru Jude.

What happened with Saul of Tarsus, what happened with Philip in Samaria (Acts 8) were UNIQUE events, not patterns for us to mimic.

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My sense of this, based upon the doctrinal teachings in Romans thru Jude – is that this was the final piece of the Puzzle for Saul, that which put him into the mode of Repentance and Trust in Christ, when a person like Ananias, a follower of the Way (Jesus/Yeshua) would lovingly lay his hands on him, in love, in the Messiah's Name. Saul was puzzled, humbled, and waiting for God's answers for 3 whole days. The old Saul was dying – but then after 3 days and 3 nights – Saul experienced the Resurrection Power of Jesus Christ.

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When Ananias laid his hands on him, spoke to him the Gospel of Christ, that was it, and Saul repented of his sins and trusted in Christ as his only Salvation from the plague of sin (read Romans 7 – that is Saul's experience of this time – going from sinful law keeper but also law breaker – to wretched man that I am ...). Again, this was a UNIQUE Event – Unique in all of History – Unique calling of a New Apostle.

Laying on of Hands is NOT necessary for sinners to be Saved. Think how crazy it would be if it was necessary ... just think ...

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When the Holy Spirit was received into Saul – Saul was Born Again, Born from Above, Born of the Spirit. This was NOT a 2nd Work of the Holy Spirit. This was the FIRST and Only Reception of the Holy Spirit who took up residence within Saul. The Holy Spirit, the Spirit of Jesus, The Spirit of Christ, the Spirit of Truth – He is the one who causes lost sinners to be Born Again and Baptizes them into the Body of Christ (ref. 1 Cor. 12:13). Saul was Saved when that Happened, NOT before that happened. For 3 days, God's Spirit was preparing him for that.

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17 And Ananias went his way and entered the house; and laying his hands on him he said, “Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus, who appeared to you on the road as you came, has sent me that you may receive your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit.” 18 Immediately there fell from his eyes something like scales, and he received his sight at once; and he arose and was baptized.

19 So when he had received food, he was strengthened. Then Saul spent some days with the disciples at Damascus.

Salvation came to Saul – he went and was Water Baptized, AFTER He was Genuinely Born Again in Christ.

Then he joined the local church family there and stayed with them for many days ... Saul needed this ... A baby Christian needs nurture. But he grew up very quickly

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20 Immediately he PREACHED the Messiah in the synagogues, that He is the Son of God.

21 Then all who heard were amazed, and said, “Is this not he who destroyed those who called on this name in Jerusalem, and has come here for that purpose, so that he might bring them bound to the chief priests?”

22 But Saul increased all the more in strength, and confounded the Jews who dwelt in Damascus, PROVING that this Jesus is the Messiah.

So, while Saul was a member of that local church fellowship, he ventured out and wanted others to be Saved, like he was. Folks knew who he was and he was undeterred and continued to share the Gospel with Reasons, Facts, Proofs, and Evidences → Jesus is the Messiah.

Evangelism right from the start – something we can learn from

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What can we learn from this passage

- 1. We should always Pray for those who are Persecuting us, for their Salvation – who know how many “Sauls” are out there ready to be used of God when they are saved – but currently they are persecuting the church. So, Pray for the Persecutors ...**
- 2. This was a Unique Event and cannot and should not be Replicated. How Saul was saved, what led to his salvation, etc. was very, very unique, one of a kind, Jesus went out of His way to get Saul.**
- 3. Salvation is always received the same way – Repentance and Faith in Christ, then God’s Spirit takes up Residence as the Presence of Christ in us – Born Again, in Christ (ref. Eph. 1:13-14).**
- 4. Evangelistic Passion should be normal after we are saved in Christ. If that passion isn’t there, did salvation really take place?**
